## MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TRINITY RIVER VISION AUTHORITY ("TRVA") HELD ON THE 2nd DAY OF NOVEMBER, 2016 AT 2:00 PM

The motion was seconded by Director Espino with Directors Maenius, Henderson, Oliver, Cooke and Espino voting in favor. Director Riley abstained from voting.

With the recommendation of Stacy Beeson (TRVA), Director Riley moved to receive and file the Quarterly Fair Contracting Report. The motion was seconded by Director Oliver and the vote in favor was unanimous.

### A6.

With the recommendation of Jenna Brummett (TRVA, Assistant Project Manager), Director Riley made a motion to contract with Pastor, Behling & Wheeler, LLC for operation and maintenance support of the groundwater treatment system at the former Luminant site in the amount of \$74,330 and to authorize Woody Frossard to sign the contract documents. The motion was seconded by Director Oliver and the vote in favor was unanimous.

### A7.

Director Oliver moved to re-elect incumbent officers President GK Maenius, Vice President David Cooke, Treasurer Bob Riley, and Secretary JD Granger. The motion was seconded by Director Espino and the vote in favor was unanimous.

### V. Discussion Items

D1.

TRVA News, Events and Development

1.

Shanna Cate (TRVA, Programming and Development Manager) reported to the Board that the Urban Land Institute's Fall Conference featured a tour of the Trinity River Vision Project and a presentation by J.D. Granger. Ms. Cate also reported on Oktoberfest held September 22-24 at Panther Island. She noted for the Board that this year's Oktoberfest added a VIP ticket option, expanded the festival footprint, added additional vendors, and included free parking for Audi vehicles sponsored by Audi Fort Worth. She reported attendance at this year's event increased to about 11,000 compared to 10,000 in 2015. She also noted for the Board that this year's Oktoberfest

was featured in *West Fort Worth Lifestyle* magazine, garnered approximately 122 hotel rooms, and was part of an in-kind campaign with the Fort Worth Convention & Visitors Bureau. Ms. Cate highlighted the 2016 Oktoberfest sponsors, including Ben E. Keith, Audi Fort Worth, Hilton Garden Inn, Fort Worth-Star Telegram, NBC5, the City of Fort Worth and Yelp. Ms. Cate reported that Panther Island Ice will begin setting up to open for the season on November 18. Last, Ms. Cate reported to the Board on recent articles including the *Fort Worth-Star Telegram* "Developer Buys Land for First Apartments at Fort Worth's Panther Island", *Dallas Morning News* "Dallas Apartment Builder Heads to Fort Worth With First Panther Island Project", *Fort Worth Business Press* "Developer Announces Multi-Family Project for Panther Island District", and *Texas Architect* "Boardwalk on Lady Bird Lake".

J.D. Granger (TRVA, Executive Director) provided a Panther Island Development Committee update to the Board on the Panther Island Development Committee. Mr. Granger reported the Committee discussed the Encore multi-family project, canal design, stormwater design, developer participation, accessibility challenges between Panther Island and downtown, and valley storage.

D2.

Update on Panther Island/Central City Project

1.

Ms. Brummett gave an update on the Panther Island/Central City Project. Ms. Brummett reported that the partial response action plan implementation for McKinley Ironworks, UPRR Spur and Texas Refinery is progressing. She further reported that concrete has been scraped up and hauled off and underground storage tanks (UST's) will be removed at the project site. Ms. Brummett also reported that the old Coburn Catering warehouse has been demolished and asbestos

abatement was completed prior to demolition. Lastly, she reported that the StarRFoam demolition will start tomorrow and should be completed in 30 days.

2.

On behalf of the City of Fort Worth (COFW), Doug Rademaker, P.E. (COFW, TRV Project Manager) provided an update on the bridge construction progress. Mr. Rademaker showed the Board photographs of the construction progress and reported that non-destructive testing (sonar analysis) of the mockup is complete and destructive testing is underway (saw-cutting of the mockup for visual inspection of the core). He explained the testing process to the Board. Mr. Rademaker showed the Board a video of the destructive testing. He reported that the results of the testing have exceeded all expectations and do not evidence any design problems. He also reported that Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is preparing its final written results. He advised the Board that the contractor has been authorized to place the V-pier steel order. Additionally, Mr. Rademaker reported that the Henderson Street Bridge cast-in-place walls are complete. Next, he noted that construction of the White Settlement Road Bridge M&C walls has commenced.

Katherine Beck (COFW, TRV Project Manager) provided an update to the Board on financial issues associated with the bridges. She reported that TxDOT continues its review of change orders. She also provided an overview of the TxDOT change order review process and provided an explanation of the financial responsibility of the City of Fort Worth. Last, she reported that City of Fort Worth has requested a revised schedule which should be available in December.

The Board requested that Brian Barth, (TxDOT, District Engineer) be invited to the December board meeting to provide an updated bridge construction schedule and a recommendation for resolution of the pending change orders and potential delay claims with input from city project managers.

### Update on TRV-Gateway Park Master Plan

Ms. Brummett provided an update on the Gateway Park Master Plan. She reported that dirt work is progressing at the Oxbow A and C sites. She reported that all dirt has been removed west of Hope Church and a temporary river crossing has been constructed. She noted that the river crossing will stay in place until the end of November. She also reported that all soil has reached Site L at East First and Oakland. Next, she reported that a pre-construction meeting was held November 15 for the Ham Branch valley storage work. Last, she noted that submittals are pending for the Riverside Park valley storage and work should commence in the next couple of weeks.

D4.

Update on Citywide Recreation TRV Master Plan

1.

Wayne Owen, (TRWD, Planning Director) reported to the Board that the Trinity Trash Bash will move back to the Spring in the future. He also showed the Board a video of the event which included approximately 7,000 volunteers.

2.

Valerie Jay (Streams and Valleys, Assistant Director) reported that Streams and Valleys will once again conduct pop-up surveys along the Trinity Trails. She also reported that Streams and Valleys will hold its annual meeting on November 7. Last, she noted that the Streams and Valleys Holiday Party will be held December 14 at Sundance Pavilion.

D5.

The next TRVA Board of Directors meeting scheduled for December 7 at 2:00 pm will be rescheduled due to conflicts.

### V. Executive Session

President Maenius next called an executive session at 3:36 P.M. under Section 551.072 of the Texas Government Code to deliberate the purchase or value of real property and under Section 551.071 of the Texas Government Code to conduct a private consultation with attorneys regarding pending or contemplated litigation and to consult with legal counsel on a matter in which the duty of counsel under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct clearly conflicts with Chapter 551, Texas Government Code. The executive session concluded, and President Meanius reconvened the regular session at 4:20 P.M., noting that a quorum was present.

There being no further business before the Board of Directors, the meeting was adjourned at 4:20 P.M.
